

#### The Book Project

Thanks to your generous grant, we continue to create living legacies with the Book Project. We have completed 46 books in the last year. Surveys demonstrate an overwhelming 100% satisfaction. Families were most touched by the personalization of the book and its responses. Upon receipt, patients were observed to read their book to their medical team during their clinic visit. Two families had the opportunity to receive the book after the loss of their child; it will be a lasting keepsake. We have had siblings and patients make books with all diagnoses. In addition, parents have made the book for their infants and toddlers. In one case, a mother made the book to help her other children understand more about her infant's cancer diagnosis. The books have been a powerful tool in more ways than we anticipated. We have signed with a new printer and look forward to continuing the process.

#### **Survivor Challenge**



On March 9 thru April 27<sup>th</sup>, 15 families began their training for the annual Color Run 5K. After eight weeks of training, those CBCC families formed part of a total of 64 Survivor Challenge participants who crossed the finish line that day (dusted in every color of the rainbow). We deeply appreciate your support of our program as we endeavor to educate families on the value of exercise and healthy eating. Very exciting for them!!
